Pool Rules

Per the Bylaws of the Twin Lakes Master Association, Inc, the Board of Directors shall have power to suspend the right of an Owner to use the Common Area and facilities there on for a period not to exceed 60 days for any infraction of the published rules and regulations of the Association.

Lifeguards are responsible for monitoring conduct in the pool and pool area. Their instructions must be followed at all times.

Lifeguards have the authority to expel persons from the pool area who disregard the rules.

1. Members must be in "Good Standing" with the HOA in order access the Twin Lakes facilities.
2. Each family must use their key fob to enter the pool facility. The gate should not be opened for anyone as they may not be members or members in good standing.
3. Each family is allowed up to four (4) guests.
4. Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a parent or parent-approved guardian.
5. Proper swim attire is required. No cut-offs or street clothes are allowed in the pool.
6. Individuals with bandages, open wounds, sores or skin infections will not be permitted in the pool.
7. All non-trained or newly toilet-trained children MUST wear disposable or re-usable "swim diapers" when in the pool or pool area. No standard disposable diapers are allowed in the pool.
8. Glass of any sort is prohibited inside the pool fence. Chewing gum, smoking, whistles or animals of any kind are all strictly prohibited within the pool and pool area. No smoking inside the pool fence.
9. Toys, games and inflatable devices will be allowed when pool population allows. Lifeguards reserve the right to regulate the use of pool toys. "Super-soaker" type squirt guns are restricted to no larger than 16".
10. All flotation devices (play toys or safety devices) are prohibited from the adult swim lane. The adult swim lane is reserved for lap and fitness swimmers. Please refrain from entering the adult swim lane when it is being used for this intended purpose.
11. Hanging or playing on the ropes is NOT permitted.
12. The patio furniture shall not be used as playground equipment.
13. Playing or loitering in the bathrooms is prohibited.
14. Skateboards, bicycles, roller blades and hard balls are prohibited within the pool fence.
15. Running, profanity and any other potentially dangerous behaviors are prohibited.
16. Lifeguards will call for a 10-minute break every hour. During break time, only adults over the age of 18 or adults with infant children are allowed in the pool. All patrons must keep back 2 feet from water's edge during lifeguard break time.
17. Lifeguards are responsible for the safety of pool members and their guests. In the event of a safety concern, the lifeguards may deem it necessary to clear the pool. They will announce to members and guests in attendance notice of the situation and notify them of the anticipated reopening time.
18. At the first sound of thunder, the pool will be vacated. At the first sign of lightening, the pool and deck area will vacated. Pool will remain closed for 30 minutes after the last clap of thunder or sign of lightning. The Lifeguards will note the time and advise when it is safe to re-open.
19. Members are responsible for cleaning up after themselves. Please dispose of all trash in appropriate containers and do not leave food /drink remnants as they attract ants and bees.
20. Underage and excessive drinking of alcoholic beverages is strictly prohibited. Lifeguards may expel intoxicated persons at their discretion.
21. Private parties must be scheduled in advance through Aquatic Management Group at 919-600-4117. Anyone having a private party may not prohibit other members from using the facilities and are required to pay for additional guards if deemed necessary by AMG. Private parties are permitted except for the following: Saturdays or Sundays after 12 pm or on any holiday or holiday weekend. Designated area must be used for all parties. Wrist bands must be worn by party patrons at all times. All residents understand that they must adhere to normal pool guest policy once the party ends. All party hosts are responsible for cleaning after their party.
22. Open fire and fireworks are strictly prohibited in the pool area.
23. No one is allowed inside the pool gate when a lifeguard is not on duty. Anyone found in violation of this policy will be removed from the pool and suspended from pool privileges for the remainder of the year. Violation of this policy can also result in the pool being closed down for the season by the Wake County Health Department.
